Introduction to Evidence-Based Treatment Planning (EBTP)

This workshop will introduce a model for evidence-based treatment planning for use by the CAC MDTs to develop and implement empirically supported treatment plans in their communities and will explore ways to ensure treatment plans for children and families are individualized, appropriate and evidence-supported when possible. In line with the primary mission of MDTs and the NCA mental health accreditation standard, EBTP is a multi-agency, community-based approach to developing a consensus on the treatment and case management plan for families. EBTP is designed to increase communication, reduce treatment plan discrepancies between professionals, speed adjudication, and improve outcomes. This workshop is designed for all members of the CAC MDT.

Workshop Participants will:

- Learn about a model for Evidence-Based Treatment Planning.
- Understand the MDT roles and responsibilities in the development of a coordinated community intervention (EBTP) for child victims and their families.
- Learn the key elements of an Evidence-Based Treatment Plan and identify ways to incorporate these elements into the MDT case review process.
